LEGAL EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR ASYLUM SEEKERS AND REFUGEES IN MILAN

Between September and November 2018, global business law firm DLA Piper, along with Coalizione Italiana per le Libertà e I Diritti civili and Pro Bono Italia will run the **Know Your Rights Project** in Milan.

Know Your Rights is a 10-week legal education program for up to 25 asylum seekers, refugees and migrants with various forms of protection ("newcomers") who are building new lives in Italy.

If you are a newcomer based in or around Milan and you want to know more about your rights and duties whether related to starting a business, getting a job, your healthcare, your education, housing and more, this course is for you!

What are the requirements to apply?

1. You are over 18 years old.
2. You speak Italian or English at B1 level.
3. You live in or near Milan.
